## HONORARY LIFE MEMBERSHIP

According to By-law 37 of the Association, Life Membership, Honoris Causa, may be granted by unanimous decision of Council to a member who has, in the opinion of Council, rendered meritorious service to the Association, who is no longer practising on a full-time basis as a Professional Engineer, and who has preferably been continously a member for not less than 35 years and has attained the age of 65.

## Carson Howard Templeton

Carson Howard Templeton became registered with this Association on June 20, 1955, having been a member of the Association of Professional Engineers of the Province of British Columbia and a member of the Association of Professional Engineers, Geologists and Geophysicists of Alberta since 1947.

Mr. Templeton served for six years on the Consulting Engineers
Committee, for five years on the Advisory Committee, for three years on the
Employee Engineers Committee, for two years on the Committee to Study the
Engineering Profession Act, for one year on the Nominating Committee and
for thirteen years on the Bulletin Committee. Mr. Templeton received the
Association's Merit Award in 1975, the Outstanding Service Award in 1981
and becomes the first member in the Association's history to have received all
three Association awards.

Honorary Life Membership was conferred on Carson Templeton by Council on December 10, 1984, following a recommendation from the Awards Committee.
