Under the general direction of the Manager of Wastewater Services, the Wastewater Engineer is responsible for all aspects of management, administration, operation, control and maintenance of the three major regional wastewater treatment plants and the biosolids (sludge) reuse program. The Wastewater Engineer provides professional engineering input into the Department's major design/construction capital program and approves those engineering designs by outside consultants which affect the branch. The Wastewater Engineer is responsible for making timely decisions in all situations including emergencies related to the operation of the City's three water pollution control centers.

As the Wastewater Engineer you will:

- Manage three major regional wastewater treatment plants and the biosolids reuse program
- Ensure that all wastewater treatment processes meet the established plant objectives, Provincial licenses and all other relevant legislation
- Plan, review, approve and implement annual short and long term operating, maintenance and upgrade programs consistent with technological developments
- Communicate with the regulatory agencies, public, media, politicians and other civic staff as required
- Oversee the management of human resources issues in the branch with 5 direct reports and approximately 75 indirect reports, including recruitment and selection, scheduling, performance management, coaching, discipline, and training
- Review and approve engineering designs and construction drawings
- Manage the Wastewater Treatment Branch's operating budget and provide input to the capital budget
- Provide professional engineering input into the Department's major design/construction capital program
- Lead all aspects of the Department's Winnipeg Sewage Treatment Program in relation to treatment plant operation and maintenance
- Ensure compliance with Worker's Compensation Legislation, Human Rights Legislation, safety regulations and safe work practices
- Act as Operator in Charge in rotation for the wastewater treatment system
- Participate as a member of the Wastewater Services Division leadership team in strategic planning, business planning, and process improvement initiatives
- Act as Manager or other member of the Division leadership team, as required
