The Dam Safety & Major Structures unit is responsible for the operations and maintenance at the 9 major structures and oversight of Dam Safety and Geotechnical support at the 69 dams owned by WSA. This position will have you working on projects primarily at WSA's major structures. These projects include rehabilitation, inspections, regular maintenance activities, assisting with gate operations and testing, and work planning. With this work, the job includes creating and managing contracts, drafting and evaluation of technical reports, creating and assisting with annual work plans, and equipment procurement. In addition to these core activities, providing input on the major structures for the Dam Safety, Geotechnical, and other units of WSA is a component of this position.

You will work among a diverse and passionate team of professionals from fields including engineering, water quality, ecology, law, sociology, and public policy to name a few, that are leading this exciting challenge in our province.

The successful candidate must have a degree in Civil Engineering or a similar engineering discipline, a license to practice professional engineering from the Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of Saskatchewan (APEGS) and 4 years of related experience.

Note: Applicants with the required education but lesser experience may be considered for an Engineer-in-Training position at a lower management classification. Applicants with the required education and more than 10 years of directly related experience may be considered for a Senior Engineer position at a higher management classification.
