2024 Salary and Compensation Survey Engineers/Geoscientists Members

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Key Findings

Profile of Respondents

- More than three-quarters of respondents identify as male.
- The average age of those participating in the survey is 39 years, rising to 53 among Advanced Level engineers.
- One in five were born outside of Canada, rising to one-third of Entry Level engineers.
- Four in five say their principal work location is Winnipeg.
- Slightly more than one in ten changed employers in 2023.
- Virtually all work full-time.
- Overall, engineers/geoscientists have practiced an average of 14 years. Canadian experience averaged 12 years while experience gained outside of this country averaged eight years.
- Most respondents were engineers. Only a handful identified as geoscientists.
- Around one in ten belong to a union, particularly those working in the public sector.

Employment Dimensions

- Overall, nearly three-quarters are employed by private companies, particularly Entry Level engineers (82%). Crown Corporations employ 15 per cent of the Intermediate and Advanced engineers participating in the research.
- More than one in ten are employed in Consulting (23%), Utilities (16%) or Manufacturing (13%) with the rest employed in a wide variety of industries.
- Design (30%), Project Management (20%) and Management (17%) are the principal job functions mentioned most often by respondents.
- Four in ten work for firms with greater than 500 employees, with higher level engineers most likely to be employed by these larger firms. Around one-quarter work in mid-size firms (21-500 employees).
- Overall, members' official work week is 38.47 hours with most typically working slightly more on average (41.37 hrs.).
- Seven in ten worked remotely or hybrid-ly in 2023. This was most common among Junior and Intermediate Level engineers as well as women. Among hybrid workers, around one-third of work was remote with two-thirds done in the office.

Industry Sectors and Job Functions with Highest and Lowest Mean Base Salary

- Overall, the industry sectors with the highest mean base salaries this sounding are Telecommunications (\$135,125), Transportation Equipment (\$128,349) and Metals-Fabricating (\$123,800).
- The sectors with the lowest mean base salaries include Agricultural/Equipment (\$87,743) and Biomedical (\$88,980).
- The job functions with the highest mean base salaries include Management (\$135,309), Teaching \$134,508) and Administrative Services (\$132,020).
- The lowest paid job functions include Quality Assurance (\$75,809) and Computer Services (\$89,192).

Overtime Compensation

 One-third continue to not receive any compensation for working overtime, particularly Advanced Level engineers (48% do not receive overtime remuneration). One-third overall receive a combination of pay and time off for working overtime, particularly those working in the public sector (45%).

Satisfaction with Remuneration

- Overall, satisfaction with remuneration remains quite stable.
 Seven in ten are satisfied with their level of remuneration (71% vs. 72% satisfied as reported in 2023) although high levels of satisfaction do not reach 50 per cent.
- Those working in the private sector were more satisfied with their remuneration overall, compared to those working in the public sector (73% vs. 65%).
- Satisfaction is correlated with the levels of experience held by engineers. Entry Level engineers are less satisfied than other levels (63% satisfied among Entry Level vs. 72% among Junior Level and 75% among Intermediate and Advanced Level engineers).

Salary Increases

- Salary increases were slightly lower in 2023. Overall, four in five received at least one salary adjustment in 2023 that included a net salary percentage increase of 6.3% (down from 7.1% reported for 2022). Entry Level and Junior Level engineers received the highest salary increases among their cohorts.
- Those working in the private sector received a higher salary increase than those in the public sector (6.9% vs. 4.8%).
- Two-thirds received their increase based on merit with one in five receiving a cost-of-living increase.
- A very small number experienced a decrease in salary, mostly due to changing employers.

Full-Time Remuneration

- The average base salary plus bonuses, overtime and other financial compensation (including commissions) for full-time engineers/geoscientists is \$114,936.61, with the median total salary of \$105,602. Note this year overtime and other monetary compensation such as commissions are included.
 - Entry Level: \$78,164.70 (with a base salary of \$73,611.63 and a median salary of \$74,000).
 - Junior Level: \$98,931.36 (with a base salary of \$91,672.05 and a median salary of \$95,250).
 - Intermediate Level: \$123,653.19 (with a base salary of \$112,967.12 and a median salary of \$120,000).
 - Advanced Level: \$157,433.37 (with a base salary of \$138,237.56 and a median salary of \$141,000).
- Those working hourly earned an average of \$50.72, rising to \$64.13 per hour among Advanced Level engineers.

- Overall, those working in the private and public sectors earned approximately the same amount of gross salary (\$115,471.87 private sector vs. \$114,197.87 public sector), although the average median salary is higher among those working in the public sector compared to their private sector counterparts (\$117,000 vs. \$100,000 respectively). Engineers/Geoscientists working in the education or non-profit sectors, on the other hand, earned slightly less than those in the other sectors (\$109,419.18 gross average salary, with a median salary closer to the private sector at \$97,671.50).
- Gender-wise, men continue to earn around 15 percent more than their female counterparts. Male professionals on average earned \$117,173.02 (gross average salary) compared to a female's gross average salary of \$102,057.72. However, this disparity in salaries is most acute when examining maximum gross salaries paid to men and women. Here, the maximum gross salary of men is double that of women (\$437,000 men vs. \$215,700 for women).

Part-Time Remuneration and Working Weeks

- Overall, the average base salary paid to part-time engineers/ geoscientists is \$61,228.73. (Note this data is based on a very small sample of 15 respondents.)
- Average base salaries for men and women working part-time mirror the disparity among full-time workers. Men's part-time gross salary is \$64,155.50 vs. \$49,521.67 among women. However, women received double the amount of overtime pay on average than men for their part-time work (\$4,666.67 vs. \$2,701.42).
- Overall, those working part-time averaged 36.53 weeks per year.

Paid Benefits

- All receive paid vacation time although not all receive paid sick days. Most notably, just slightly more than one in ten Entry Level engineers (15%) and those who work in the private sector (17%) do not receive paid sick days.
- Overall, engineers/geoscientists average 18 days of paid vacation a year (rising to 22 days for Advanced Level engineers).

- Around one-half of respondents share the costs of their dental, drug and extended health plans with their employers, although those working in the public sector were more likely to have these benefits paid by their employer.
- More than one-half share the costs of a pension plan and RRSPs, while a majority (67%) do not have any stock purchase options through their employer.
- Life insurance and long-term disability were most likely to be a shared expense between employer/employee. However, Advanced Level engineers were more likely than their lowerlevel counterparts to have their employer pay for their short and long-term disability insurance.
- Parental leave EI top-up, on the other hand, was not offered as a benefit for one-quarter of engineers. Two in five were unsure if their employer offered maternity/adoption leave.
- A majority of employers pay for professional development courses including continuing education (52%) and job training (79%).
- In terms of professional dues, 79 per cent had their professional dues paid by their employer and 58 per cent had technical society dues paid by their employers.

Benefits Offered by Employers

- Around one-quarter of engineers (especially those working in the private sector) are offered additional financial benefits including profit sharing (24%), a savings plan (29%), a productivity incentive (15%) or a corporate share dividend (13%).
- Flexible work hours (77%) and leaves of absence (57%) are offered by a majority of employers, although job sharing was less apparent (9%).
- Vehicles (8%) and vehicle allowances (17%) are provided by far fewer employers, although four in 10 have paid parking provided. One-quarter of those who work in the public sector have a vehicle allowance offered by their employers.
- Cell phone reimbursement was paid by three in five employers with far fewer Entry Level engineers having this benefit provided, compared to Advanced Level engineers (40% vs. 71%).

- For engineers/geoscientists who are parents, parental leave is offered by around one-half of employers (51%) while daycare is offered by only 1% of employers (rising to a high of 11% among those in the non-profit/educational sectors). Two-thirds of those who work in the public sector and women have parental leave offered through their employer.
- Liability insurance is a benefit provided by one-third of employers. Advanced Level engineers are far more likely to have this benefit as part of their employment package compared to Entry Level engineers (47% vs. 19%).

Roles and Responsibilities

This year, a new line of enquiry was included in an effort to determine levels of responsibilities among engineers.

- Three in ten described their duties as being a fully qualified professional, with only four per cent in the "early training" phase and one per cent at the upper end of the duties, describing their role as a CEO.
- One-quarter identified their level of responsibility as making responsible decisions as well as functional decisions while six per cent were at the lowest level – only making routine decisions and three per cent at the upper end – making strategic decisions.
- Forty per cent indicated they work towards objectives to be accomplished independently while one per cent are still working under close supervision and three per cent determine policies, plans and programs.

- Fifteen per cent do not have a supervisor role at all, while a plurality of one-third described themselves as an individual contributor. Senior leaders/executives made up ten per cent of respondents.
- Very few engineers/geoscientists supervise more than 50 others.
- Thirteen per cent regularly/frequently use their professional seal, rising to around two in 10 among more senior level engineers.



Methodology

Research Objectives

Engineers Geoscientists Manitoba conducted an online survey among its engineer and geoscience members. The purpose of the research was to collect information on the salary and compensation packages provided by employers for 2023. Probe Research Inc. was retained to review and develop the survey, analyze the data and report on the findings.

Methodology

An online survey was administered and made available by Engineers Geoscientists Manitoba to its members via their database portal. Notice of the survey was sent by bulk email to the members who had opted in to the 'Enews Consent' mailing list.

The survey was available for completion from May 28 to June 24, 2024.

A total of 1,223 members completed the survey out of 6,411 eligible candidates, for a response rate of 19%. It should be noted that those who completed either the salary and/or only other sections of the survey are included in these results, therefore bases may vary.

Sample

The survey was offered to all interns, members, and specified scope of practice licensees, who were eligible while the survey was open with a home and work address in Manitoba. Self-employed engineers/geoscientists are not included in these results.

With a sample of 1,223 eligible engineers/geoscientists, the margin of error is \pm 2.37 percentage points, 19 times out of 20 (finite population correction).



Experience Level Definitions


Below are the definitions used to describe the four levels of engineers/geoscientists as of December 31, 2023 who participated in this research:

Entry Level: This includes engineering/geoscience interns (EIT/GIT) who have not yet received their professional designation and/or who have 1-4 years of experience after graduation.

Junior Level: This includes engineers/geoscientists with a professional designation (P.Eng./P.Geo.) and who have 5-9 years of experience after graduation.

Intermediate Level: This includes engineers/geoscientists with a professional designation (P.Eng./P.Geo.) and 10-19 years of experience after graduation.

Advanced Level: This includes engineers/geoscientists with a professional designation (P.Eng./P.Geo.) and 20+ years of experience after graduation.




Level of Experience

Which of the following best describes your level of experience as of December 31, 2023? (Base: All respondents, N=1,223)




A Breakdown of Years Practicing: Overall


Years Practicing: By Entry and Junior Levels


Years Practicing: By Intermediate and Advanced Levels




Employment Status

Which is your primary employment sector? (Base: All respondents, N=1,223)





What is your principal job function (check all that apply)? And which is your principal job function, that is the one where you spend most of your working time? Please select one only. (Base: All respondents, N=1,223)





Size of Manitoba Employer


What is the size of your employer organization in Manitoba? (Base: All respondents, N=1,223)




Principal Work Location

Did you work remotely or a hybrid model in 2023? (Base: All respondents, N=1,223)




Work Week Percentage Remote/Office



Overall Satisfaction with Remuneration: By Sub-Groups


Overall, how satisfied are you with the level of remuneration for your current job? (Base: All respondents, N=1,223)






Base Salary Adjustments by Hours Worked Per Week and Year of Bachelor Degree






Net Salary Average Percentage Increase by Experience Level, Sector and Gender










Type of Overtime Compensation by Experience, Sector and Gender






Paid Sick Time by Experience, Organizational Sector and Gender



Average Number of Paid Vacation Days by Experience, Sector and Gender




Type of Vacation by Experience, Sector and Gender








Overall Range of Duties: By Level of Experience



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
Level of Responsibility: By Experience Level








Supervisory/Leadership: by Level of Experience
















