PLATFORM PART 2 - THE PUBLIC OF MANITOBA

The Association governs and regulates the professions in the public interest. What is, or what should, Council be doing to ensure that its governance is in the public interest and why?

Council's core responsibility is to govern the engineering and geoscience professions in a way that protects the safety, health, and well-being of the public. To be effective, Council's emphasis should be on transparency, accountability, and practices that prioritize the public's interest. This includes ensuring the Association upholds clear, enforceable standards of conduct, competence, and ethics, while it also pursues diverse perspectives from various communities, industries, and future professionals. By doing so, Council can remain responsive to evolving expectations.

PLATFORM PART 3 – THE ASSOCIATION

Council sets the expectation for the Association by defining the Ends. What is the most important End and why?

I believe the most important End is that "consumers have access to a reasonable supply of practitioners' services". Geoscience and engineering are underrepresented inside and outside schools, and early exposure can inspire students to pursue these fields. From my own classroom presentations, I see how excited students are to learn about geoscience, and I believe more outreach will help ensure a strong future supply of practitioners.

Council sets out the core characteristics of what it considers to be a good councillor in GP-6 Councillor Roles and Job Description. What is the most important characteristic of a good councillor and why?

I believe the most important characteristic of a good councillor is the "ability and willingness to participate assertively in deliberation, while respecting the opinions of others". This creates a safe space where all members can contribute, encourages open discussion, and allows diverse perspectives to strengthen decisions. Healthy debate leads to better outcomes because it draws on the unique experiences of every councillor.
